Organisers comments – Maurice Swales

Estimating probable numbers was our most difficult task. Despite sending off forms by mid February the event was not listed in BOF news or CompassSport. When seeking helpers a week before the event I felt that the JK and Easter would result in very few participants. The 89 control cards issued was quite satisfactory, perhaps 20/30 less than I felt after telephone enquiries just prior to the event. I enjoyed seeing so many different clubs represented.

I trust you all enjoyed the event. Opencast mining has reduced the reas value for orienteering, only for a few years I hope, making it difficult to accomodate accomplished orienteers wanting a longer run – thus a score event seemed more appropriate.

I was surprised more people opted for the longer course, at Christmas the numbers are usually similar.

Checking the results was interesting, the punching was generally good, very few in the wrong box. Most returned within the time allowed, some with perhaps too much time in hand – but this is the nature of a score event. Several people scored 430 on the Long, omitting controls 20 and 21. Well done those six who visited all controls in the time allowed, it looks as though Nick got it about right.

Our thanks to Nick and Don Smith for all their work in planning and controlling the event as well as those members of NN who helped run the event so smoothly.

Also sincere thanks to Mr.J.Warde-Aldam for allowing us to use the area and to his head forester, Mr.T.McDonough for keeping the area so runnable.

Planners comments – Nicholas Barrett

The mapped area at Broomley Fell contains a wealth of variety for orienteering; hillside, water features and very pleasant runnable forest. Unfortunately the large area of 'out of bounds' removed all but the latter and this was further reduced by the recent coal extraction, although it was comforting to see the care being taken in re-instating this fenced off area. After deduction of 'OOB' planning a long and short score event was by no means easy as the courses had to be suitably different yet of sufficient length so as not to be too easy.

With JK attracting the majority of competitive runners away from the region, comments from those completing the score courses showed that length / time was about right with most entrants having to miss one or two controls to get back in time. Under normal circumstances the courses may have been a little short. Well done to all those who managed all controls within time.

Entrants on the yellow course should also have experienced a 'flavour' of Broomley Fell as the course through a section of the remaining runnable forest is very pleasant.

Finally, 'an enjoyable run' summarises many of the comments made at the finish. The courses I planned, but the invigorating fresh air was arranged by someone else!
