Organisers comments – *Stephan Green.*

Firstly, sincere apologies for the delay in producing the results. I had hoped to produce them before I went away to the JK at Easter, but this proved impossible.

Thanks are due to everyone who helped on the day, and also particular thanks to Bob Johnson for planning and Dave Caudwell for controlling the event. This was my first proper event as organiser, not that that should excuse any shortcomings! I hope that you all enjoyed the event as much as I did, despite the limitations of the area and the vulnerability to vandalism.

Thanks also to the competitor who retrieved a lost compass at the last control, this has been re-united with its owner. No other lost property was handed in.

Controllers comments – *Dave Caudwell (NN).*

At the end of the competition, when the controls were collected in, we found that there were no longer control boards at 90, 'between knolls' (brown, blue and green) or 68, 'deep pit E edge' (brown, blue and green). Boards had been moved from their original sites but were found lying nearby with punches stripped from them at 91, 'niche' (brown, blue and green), 77, 'power line pole W side' (red) and 76, 'spur' (brown blue and green). Several other controls had missing punches, though the board was still in its correct location.

It is difficult to know exactly when these sites were vandalised, but later competitors were clearly more likely to be inconvenienced than earlier ones. Competitors with control cards showing nothing for the above controls have been re-instated in the results, but presumably some people may have spent a considerable time searching in vain for the boards in the correct locality and so their re-instatement is only a partial compensation.

A further problem was caused by the state of the marshes at the north end of the map near control 90, where a few competitors found them to be un-crossable although others managed to cross without difficulty. The planner assures me that he crossed without problems and although I didn't personally check the marshes for this event (I used the paths like anybody sensible would), I surveyed and drew the map and so checked them in 1985/6 and found them to be crossable then. There is no doubt, however, that for some reason (and despite the dry winter) this area is now much wetter than it ever used to be, with several paths and tracks now always under water or knee deep in mud, when previously this was not the case. Maybe this has affected the nature of the marshes in some places to make them more voracious.

Apologies to anyone whose enjoyment was affected by any of the above problems.
