Organisers comments - Julian Warren

This was my first experience of organising a badge event and even with the small entry it was still a headache. My apologies for the debacle which early starters experienced, caused by the two wayward horses bent on disrupting things. They even took a bite out of the finish tent (it must be all those lonely hours spent on the fells). Thanks to all those who helped on the day especially those who gave up their runs.

Controllers comments - Alasdair Wilson-Craw

Some adjustment was made to the badge times on courses where there were only a few runners. Thanks to the organiser and especially the planner for making my job easier.

Some background to the area and event - Dave Caudwell

On September 7th you should have had a very enjoyable day competing on this mainly open fell, new to orienteering, up by the Scottish border. The weather was pleasant, the views would have been glorious, the going underfoot generally good, the courses would have been challenging but fair, the new map superb in every detail (I'm just guessing about the last two!), so what went wrong?

The idea for an event here came when some employees of Northumbrian Water (NW from now on) attended a Business Studies course run by John Maguire at Sunderland University. John discussed the idea of NN using some of NW's land for orienteering purposes, and they thought that this would be a good idea since the water company would also be able to use the maps for management training exercises. They owned a centre for these activities at Catcleugh Reservoir, and it was suggested to John that we could use any part of the open fell up there which they owned and which we thought was suitable. They provided a map of the area owned by NW and this area could easily have swallowed 3 National Events.

So it was in October 1996 I went to see the NW's land agent at Catcleugh with a view to agreeing on an area that I could get started on. After looking round the area, I decided that the Lumsdon Law section would be best. It is a large area of mainly short grass, virtually no bracken, with a multitude of contour features, few walls or fences, and only one track. Some parts have excellent rock features, but it is very steep, there is quite a lot of tussocky marsh and visibility is too good, the area being a U shape round a steep stream valley. (See section of map at 1:10000 for a typical bit). The land agent sent me to see the two men who ran sheep over the area (I assumed that these were the tenant farmers - a big mistake!), and they agreed to us using the land as long as it did not interfere with the lambing season.

I went back to the land agent and we talked about other problems which might affect us, like shooting tenants. He said all the game birds had been shot years ago and all that was left were a few Blackcock, not enough to have a proper shoot. We talked about car parking and he

offered a field below the reservoir. This was a good solid field but was a good 2km away from the edge of the mapped area. As the event was at this stage scheduled for late November, he thought that no other field any closer could be relied upon to be firm enough to take cars if it were wet that day. (Highly likely, apparently.)

And that was that! I drove home congratulating myself on a job well done, pleased with the co-operation of everyone concerned, and set about transferring an OS basemap onto OCAD so that I could set about surveying the area.

In all, I made 36 visits to Lumsdon Law. The weather there in November persuaded me that another time of year would be preferable, so I persuaded Maurice to negotiate for another date and he came up with September 7th 1997. I got to know one of the shepherds very well, and we (Rob McKenna had been appointed Organiser) re-negotiated the parking arrangements for a field right next to the start/finish area. Everything was going exceptionally well. By the end of June, I thought another 3 or 4 visits would enable me to finish the map, I had already planned all the courses except the two longest, and I was contemplating starting to tape some of the control sites. The only drawback so far was the fact that NW had decided to sell the land, but even this seemed to be good luck for us as the selling date was to be October 1997 which was after our badge event was over, although it would have been before the original date planned for the event.

The bombshell arrived on July 2nd in the shape of a phone call from the shepherd. "What" he said, "Have you done about Miss Hedley?" I thought quickly. Who the hell was Miss Hedley? Was I being accused of abducting some Redesdale beauty? I gave in and said I didn't know who Miss Hedley was, so I hadn't done anything about her. "She's the tenant farmer" he said. I said that I thought he was the tenant farmer, but he said that no, he just worked for her. Could I ring her up? Well, I could, but the lady was in her late eighties, was blind and deaf, so it wouldn't be much use. The only way to get in touch was to write to her so that the farm secretary would read the letter out to her on a Tuesday when she visited. The shepherd thought she might or might not agree to the event going ahead, but agreed that I could say that we had his full co-operation and support for what we were planning to do. When I asked him why he had not mentioned Miss Hedley before, he said that he thought that when I first went to see him, I had already got permission from her, but I find it hard to see how he came to that conclusion, since the only reference I made was to NW.

NW's land agent was more upbeat. He said that he could see no reason for her to refuse. (I could - NW were about to throw her out of the house she had lived in all her life in October.) Not only that, but NW's top brass were concerned that the event should go ahead, whatever, and would put their full weight behind us. When I asked him why he hadn't mentioned Miss Hedley to me, his reply was that he thought the shepherds would sort all that out for us!

Needless to say, Miss Hedley refused her permission. Nothing NW's top brass could do would persuade her otherwise, so eventually the land agent accepted defeat and so did we. Ironically, the same week some sponsorship money for the map arrived from NW, as did an official letter giving us written permission to stage the event!

I still don't know precisely what everybody's motives were. Were the shepherds happy (initially) to keep it from Miss Hedley safe in the knowledge that she would not find out about it, being blind and deaf? Was it the sale of the land by NW which annoyed everyone? Why didn't the land agent tell me about his tenant farmer?

Everything may not yet be lost of course. In October a new owner of the property (possibly the National Trust) takes over and we may be able to persuade them to allow us to use the area. You might get a run on Lumsdon Law yet! Watch this space.
