The Navigation Challenge

BO members are eligible for a Navigation Challenge certificate after successfully completing 3 colour coded courses at the same Technical Difficulty (TD) standard. The certificates are 'star' based e.g. 1 star for TD 1 up to 5 Star for TD 5.

The Racing Challenge

BO members are also eligible for a Racing Challenge certificate after successfully completing 3 colour coded courses (of the same TD) within the following times.

Gold award - Participants time < Course length (km) x 12.5 mins Silver award - Participants time < Course length (km) x 15 mins Bronze award - Participants time < Course length (km) x 20 mins

There were a few restrictions on the planning set by the Park Ranger who was aware that damage may be done to the flora and fauna of the fragile make up of Washingwell Wood in particular, but protection of the young trees in the Watergate Park area has been eased allowing a better route choice in this area. Thanks to the small but happy band of NN helpers who made the event run smoothly.

Controller's comments - Rob McKenna

Watergate Forest Park can be very fast, particularly around the lake, but does get a little bit more technical and physical once into Washingwell Woods. I do hope that competitors on the longer courses enjoyed the extension out to Bucks Hill Wood and Lotties Wood - they both add to the variety on offer at this venue.

Listening to some of the comments at the finish, competitors seemed to enjoy the challenges set and leading times look to be about right. The use of the laminated signs and punches, although a bit antiquated by todays electronic standards, but necessary in this area, seemed to be accepted by most. They can be tricky to use and do keep your hands full. Perhaps with a bit different planning more secure control sites may be found to enable the use an electronic system which may allow better use of the area - possibly next time.
