### The Navigation Challenge.

BO members are eligible for a Navigation Challenge certificate after successfully completing 3 colour coded courses at the same Technical Difficulty (TD) standard. The certificates are 'star' based e.g. 1 star for TD 1 up to 5 Star for TD 5.

### The Racing Challenge.

BO members are also eligible for a Racing Challenge certificate after successfully completing 3 colour coded courses (of the same TD) within the following times.

Gold award - Participants time < Course length (km) x 12.5 mins

Silver award - Participants time < Course length (km) x 15 mins

Bronze award - Participants time < Course length (km) x 20 mins

### Planners Comments – Rob McKenna

I hope you all enjoyed your runs – judging from comments I heard at download it seemed you did. Some parts of Fontburn are a delight to run round although the marshy bits can be a bit tough going in places. It is difficult to get the longer courses to the correct technical level as some of the controls can be seen from some distance - the area certainly suits the faster runner.

There were quite a few changes made to the map for this event but I still spotted other possible amendments while control setting and certainly some of the boulders on the map now need removing.

I had to change the Orange course at short notice, as although on paper the course looked fine, whilst setting controls I basically followed the original course and thought it may have been a bit too physical for any younger competitors attempting it. The resulting times seem about right now, although the course is at the lower end of the range for an Orange.

The Light Green does look as if it was a bit of a challenge, but it did have a longish leg across possibly one of the toughest parts of the map. The longer courses have some very fast times at the top, but the Blue was won by a top class young runner who, even though sporting an injury, still managed sub 6 minute k's.

Although the weather was not bad on the day there wasn't the cold breeze to contend with on the Saturday while setting controls – what a delightful experience.
