



**Class I**

Routes – There were five different ways of taking the first four controls, these are coded as follows in the results below:

a – WZGM, b – WGMZ, c – MGWZ, d – GWZM, e – WGZM

These were fairly equally distributed among first leg runners (who had time to think) and there appears to have been no obvious advantage for any route. Route 'a' was very popular with second leg runners, though the fastest times were recorded on routes 'b' and 'c'. Third leg runners were divided equally between 'f' – DQN and 'g' – DNQ, with two runners opting for 'h' – NDQ.

**Class III**

On the first two legs of the course there were two sections over which choice could be exercised. The first three controls could be taken:

j – GQN, k – GNQ, or l – NGQ and later m – FTV, n – TVF or p – FVT.

Route 'j' then 'p' was easily the most popular combination with first leg runners while the second leg runners chose route 'f' (DNQ), with a small minority choosing 'g' (DNQ) or 'h' (NDQ).

### September Weekend Organisers comments

We hope that all who took part in the competitions enjoyed the courses. This weekend was not intended to be a major competition, and we were a little surprised to receive entries from the south of England and from Aberdeen, our thanks go to all who made the journey from outside the region. We were also very pleased to get the support of so many local orienteers on both days. We would, however, appreciate it if there were more advanced entries and fewer late entries in future competitions - this applied in particular to the relay where a tremendous amount of preparation was required and where preparing pre-marked maps in a hurry on the morning of the competition could have led to mistakes. A very high proportion of competitors completed their course on the Saturday and one or two of those who had incomplete cards may have visited all controls - it is a well known mistake, where the Norwegian master map system is used, to forget to punch your card at a control. The courses on Sunday were completed in very fast times - we feel that short courses are necessary for relays so that competition is close and so that competitors are not out in the forest very late. There was certainly close competition on all courses with the lead constantly changing - we hope that you will find the route analyses, given in the results, useful. We are grateful to the Forestry Commission for permission to use the two forests and to the foresters concerned for their help. We would also like to thank those competitors who willingly helped out at the finish - this sort of co-operation enables the maximum number of people to take part. One or two items of lost property were handed in to the organiser and can be claimed by sending details and postage.

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
