BO members are eligible for a Navigation Challenge certificate after successfully completing 3 colour coded courses at the same Technical Difficulty (TD) standard. The certificates are 'star' based e.g. 1 star for TD 1 up to 5 Star for TD 5.

The Racing Challenge

BO members are also eligible for a Racing Challenge certificate after successfully completing 3 colour coded courses (of the same TD) within the following times.

Gold award

your time < course length (km) x 12.5 mins

Silver award

your time < course length (km) x 15 mins

Bronze award

your time < course length (km) x 20 mins

Controller's comments - *Adrian Barnes (NATO)*

Congratulations to Northern Navigators for managing to put on this event in a short time after permission was withdrawn for their original area

I recommended to British Orienteering's Event and Competitions Committee that they use these areas despite their previous use quite recently. For a Level B event areas should not have been used within the last 12 months. I did that because I believe the areas are of a quality for a Level B event. Thankfully ECC agreed and the event went ahead

From the comments I heard you also agreed and enjoyed your runs. Now, there was some debate on Day 1 about controls 220 and 225. Comment was passed about the controls being misplaced or that the map was wrong. Having checked that area of forest (not under competition pressure), more than once, I am convinced that all was well. From the forest above (south of) the controls all the re-entrants and gully are very clear and well portrayed on Dave Caudwell's original mapping. It is less clear from the path below them as the slope rises very sharply and it is not as easy to see the land forms. Both maps are, unfortunately, showing their age and there was not enough time for a full update. I'm sure Rob was sick of me pointing out bits that essentially needed changing on the Low Redford map - new mountain bike paths and self-seeded thick trees severely reducing the run-ability in places. He did a great job for you in a very short space of time. He also managed to get time to update the vegetation around the final few controls for Day 2 as well. Again self-seeded Birch trees caused the run-ability and visibility to be compromised.

The real weakness on the moorland map is that the water features - ditches and marshes - have changed a lot. However, given the time restraints I didn't think that a change would significantly affect navigation. On reflection, the ditches around 131 at the far west end were a bit debateable. The major one running N-S was well incised with running water and most of the others had degraded to linear marshes. However, I did feel that it was still fair navigation if interpreted for what it was from the information given in the final details. I thought both Planners (Kath and Julian) brought out the characters of the two quite different areas to give you challenging courses. Finally, I really enjoy being involved with events organised by Boris for their military precision - and his ability to influence the weather!! Judging by the horror stories on Saturday from other parts of the country, he is obviously sacrificing to the right weather gods!
